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Morning in America

Did America's fortieth president lead a conservative counterrevolution that left liberalism gasping for air? The answer, for both his admirers and his detractors, is often "yes." Reagan fostered a political culture centered on individualism and consumption-finding common ground between the right and the left. Written with verve, *Morning in America* is both a major new look at one of America's most influential modern-day presidents and the definitive story of a decade that continues to shape our times.

From 1975 to 1979, in particular, he delivered more than 1,000 radio addresses, of which he wrote at least 680 himself. When drafts of his addresses were first discovered, and a selection was published in 2001 as *Reagan, In His Own Hand* by the editors of this book, they caused a sensation by revealing Reagan as a prolific and thoughtful writer, who covered a wide variety of topics and worked out the agenda that would drive his presidency. What was missed in that thematic collection, however, was the development of his ideas over time.
