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Teatro completo

La cadena de estudios del Centro de Investigación de Semiótica Literaria, Teatral y Nuevas Tecnologías (SELITEN@T), dirigido por el Dr. José Romera Castillo, sobre estos ámbitos artísticos es ya muy numerosa. De los veinticinco Seminarios Internacionales, celebrados hasta el momento, dieciséis de ellos se han dedicado al estudio del teatro, a través de diversas producciones, tanto textuales como espectaculares, desde la segunda mitad del siglo XX hasta nuestros días. Toca ahora examinar y valorar el teatro, a través de tres vertientes (la artística, la histórica y la cultura), en estos últimos tiempos. Tras un condensado panorama de la vigorosa trayectoria científica del SELITEN@T en los veinticinco años de existencia, centrándose especialmente en los estudios sobre teatro, el volumen se articula en tres apartados. En el primero, se recoge tanto un panorama del teatro documental en España y sus puestas en escena, como una serie de aportaciones teóricas sobre esta modalidad artística. En el segundo, varios dramaturgos (José Luis Alonso de Santos, Jesús Campos, Paloma Pedrero, Alberto Conejero, Fernando J. López, Eva Guillamón y Rafael Negrete) examinan sus propias obras desde la óptica indicada. Y en el tercero, se ofrecen diversos y enjundiosos estudios, publicados tras previa selección, sobre diferentes aspectos (autores, obras, puestas en escena, compañías, etc.). En conjunto, estamos, sin duda alguna, ante una serie de estudios novedosos en los que se ofrece una nueva y rigurosa visión sobre el teatro como documento artístico, histórico y cultural.

El teatro como documento artístico, histórico y cultural en los inicios del siglo XXI

Los ensayos recogidos en este libro, escritos desde distintas perspectivas críticas (del psicoanálisis a la semiótica, de la estilística a la teoría de discursos), constituyen un estudio introductorio a la figura y la obra de Bertolt Brecht, un clásico del siglo xx. El conjunto de artículos se inicia con dos trabajos sobre la Alemania pre-hitleriana y un riguroso panorama del contexto histórico en el que vivió el escritor alemán. Los grandes textos teatrales de Brecht, Madre Coraje y sus hijos, Vida de Galileo o La ópera de

cuatro cuartos, así como su poesía, son minuciosamente analizados estableciendo interpretaciones originales, y aportando numerosos datos de carácter documental. También se estudia la práctica de Brecht en el Berliner Ensemble, sus escritos teóricos y los conceptos fundamentales que articuló en su teatro: gestus, extrañamiento, epicidad. y además el trabajo musical que realizó con diferentes compositores, como Kurt Weill, Hanns Eisler o Paul Dessau, sus diseños escénicos y su relación con escenógrafos como Caspar Neher, la teoría y la práctica de la interpretación actoral en su obra y la influencia que su escritura y su pensamiento han tenido sobre otros dramaturgos, para la sociedad y para el arte. El libro incluye un amplio cuadro cronológico, una completa bibliografía de y sobre el autor, así como una pormenorizada relación de puestas en escena de obras de Brecht realizadas en España.

Introducción a Brecht

Bajo el título de Más allá de la filosofía se ofrece una serie de textos de Hannah Arendt, en su mayoría inéditos en lengua castellana, que dan a conocer el importante papel que en sus reflexiones desempeñan la crisis de la cultura, la poesía, el arte y la narración literaria. Al recoger trabajos y artículos redactados casi a lo largo de una vida, esta colección permite descubrir la articulación del estilo de su autora, la genealogía de algunos de sus conceptos más relevantes y de ciertos temas que atraviesan toda su obra. Los materiales aquí reunidos tienen un carácter heterogéneo debido a que fueron escritos con distintos propósitos, en tiempos muy diversos, publicados en dos continentes y en dos lenguas distintas por una mujer que no se cansó de insistir en que lo importante, lo verdaderamente esencial, es reflexionar a partir de la experiencia. Entre estos materiales encontramos ejercicios de pensamiento, notas para conferencias, partes de sus libros, discursos de recepción de premios, obituarios y, en fin, reseñas tanto de escritos de amigos como de obras por las que no siente afinidad alguna. A través de esta variedad de géneros, despunta una nueva perspectiva sobre el pensamiento de Hannah Arendt con la que también emergen las siluetas de autores como Rainer Maria Rilke, Bertolt Brecht, Hermann Broch, W. H. Auden o Nathalie Sarraute, que ella supo trazar de manera singular.

Madre coraje y sus hijos

This Student Edition of Brecht's classic dramatisation of the conflict over possession of a child features an extensive introduction and commentary that includes a plot summary, discussion of the context, themes, characters, style and language as well as questions for further study and notes on words and phrases in the text. It is the perfect edition for students of theatre and literature. Brecht projects an ancient Chinese story onto a realistic setting in Soviet Georgia. In a theme that echoes the Judgment of Solomon, two women argue over the possession of a child; thanks to the unruly judge, Azdak (one of

Brecht's most vivid creations) natural justice is done and the peasant Grusha keeps the child she loves, even though she is not its mother. Written in exile in the United States during the Second World War, *The Caucasian Chalk Circle* is a politically-charged, much-revived and complex example of Brecht's epic theatre. This volume contains expert notes on the author's life and work, historical and political background to the play, photographs from stage productions and a glossary of difficult words and phrases. It features the acclaimed translation by James and Tania Stern with W. H. Auden.

Más allá de la filosofía

Bertolt Brecht's extraordinary historical novel presents an aspiring scholar's efforts to write an idealized life of Julius Caesar twenty years after his death. But the historian abandons his planned biography, confronted by a baffling range of contradictory views. Was Caesar an opportunist, a permanently bankrupt businessman who became too big for the banks to allow him to fail – as his former banker claims? Did he stumble into power while trying to make money, as suggested by the diary of his former slave? Across these different versions of Caesar's career in the political and economic life of Rome, Brecht wryly contrasts the narratives of imperial progress with the reality of grasping self-interest, in a sly allegory that points to the Weimar Republic and perhaps even to our own times. Brecht reminds his readers of the need for constant vigilance and critical suspicion towards the great figures of the past. In an echo of his dramatic theories, the audience is confronted with its own task of active interpretation rather than passive acceptance -- we have to work out our own views about Mr Julius Caesar. This edition is translated by Charles Osborne and features an introduction and editorial notes by Anthony Phelan and Tom Kuhn.

A "dissident of the gender-sex binary system" reflects on gender transitioning and political and cultural transitions in technoscientific capitalism. Uranus, the frozen giant, is the coldest planet in the solar system as well as a deity in Greek mythology. It is also the inspiration for *uranism*, a concept coined by the writer Karl Heinrich Ulrich in 1864 to define the "third sex" and the rights of those who "love differently." Following Ulrich, Paul B. Preciado dreams of an apartment on Uranus where he might live beyond existing power, gender and racial strictures invented by modernity. "My trans condition is a new form of *uranism*," he writes. "I am not a man. I am not a woman. I am not heterosexual. I am not homosexual. I am not bisexual. I am a dissident of the gender-sex binary system. I am the multiplicity of the cosmos trapped in a binary political and epistemological system, shouting in front of you. I am a *uranist* confined inside the limits of technoscientific capitalism." This book recounts Preciado's transformation from Beatriz into Paul B., but it is not only an account of gender transitioning. Preciado also considers political, cultural, and sexual transition, reflecting on issues that range from the rise of neo-fascism in Europe to the technological appropriation of the uterus, from the harassment of trans children to the role museums might play in the cultural revolution to come. *An Apartment on Uranus* is a bold, transgressive, and necessary book.

The Business Affairs of Mr Julius Caesar

Undoing Gender constitutes Judith Butler's recent reflections on gender and sexuality, focusing on new kinship, psychoanalysis and the incest taboo, transgender, intersex, diagnostic categories, social violence, and the tasks of social transformation. In terms that draw from feminist and queer theory, Butler considers the norms that govern--and fail to govern--gender and sexuality as they relate to the constraints on recognizable personhood. The book constitutes a reconsideration of her earlier view on gender performativity from *Gender Trouble*. In this work, the critique of gender norms is clearly situated within the framework of human persistence and survival. And to "do" one's gender in certain ways sometimes implies "undoing" dominant notions of personhood. She writes about the "New Gender Politics" that has emerged in recent years, a combination of movements concerned with transgender, transsexuality, intersex, and their complex relations to feminist and queer theory.
