While the word "vecindad" in Spanish means "neighborhood." in Mexico City it's more than that. The first vecindades were built by wealthy Spanish colonists in a traditional Andalusian style in the 16th century.

Rooms spanned multiple stories around an open-air courtyard

The homes were anywhere from two to five stories tall, built on narrow lots out of stone or brick. the facades with intricate stonework.

Some also featured portraits of old Spanish families and religious figures

The 1800s brought industrialization and social and political upheaval

Today, some vecindades survive as cafes, shops, hotels, storage and sometimes middle-income housing.
