Und gleich mit den ersten Sätzen seines Versuchs über Perikles kommt Ebersbach auf das Geheimnis zu sprechen, weshalb die yellow press so erfolgreich war und ist: Gerüchte über das Privatleben "großer Männer" kennen alle Zeiten. Was ein beliebiger Mensch tut und lässt, findet vielleicht das Interesse seiner Nachbarn oder anderer, die ihn kennen. Ein Mann, den alle kennen, muss es hinnehmen, dass sich jeder Gedanken über ihn macht. Er mag seine privaten Vorlieben, Freuden und Ärgernisse der Öffentlichkeit, so gut er kann, verbergen. Alle wollen jedoch mehr über ihn wissen, als bekannt wird, und jeder schließt von sich auf andere. Die Vorzüge des "großen Mannes" langweilen mit ihrer Selbstverständlichkeit. Mit dem einen oder anderen kleinen Fehler, mit all den Schwächen und Lastern, die man selbst hat, lebt es sich besser, wenn auch ein Bedeutenderer nicht frei von ihnen ist. So trennt sich allmählich, zumal unter einem allgemeinen und scheinbar unumstößlichen Konsens der Gesellschaft über die moralischen Werte. von der Gestalt des berühmten Mannes ein Doppelgänger und beginnt in den neugierigen Köpfen der Leute ein Eigenleben, auf das sein ahnungsloses Original kaum noch einen Einfluss hat, dafür aber die tausendstimmige Menge umso mehr. The Other Side of Deception

Between 1967 and 2000, film production in Germany underwent a number of significant transformations, including the birth and death of New German Cinema as well as the emergence of a new transnational cinematic practice. In Projecting History, Nora M. Alter explores the relationship between German cinematic practice and the student protests in both East and West Germany against the

backdrop of the U.S. war in Vietnam in the sixties, the outbreak of terrorism in West Germany in the seventies, West Germany's rise as a significant global power in the eighties, and German reunification in the nineties. Nora M. Alter is Associate Professor of German, Film and Media Studies, and Women and Gender Studies at the University of Florida. A specialist in twentieth-century film, comparative literature, and cultural studies, Alter has been the recipient of a National Endowment for the Humanities Fellowship and a Howard Foundation Fellowship. She is also the author of Vietnam Protest Theatre: The Television War on Stage.

Uprising in East Germany 1953

From Khomeini's "divine mission" to President Mahmoud Ahmadinejad's messianic campaign in the name of the "Hidden Imam," Iran is on a trajectory towards war. The Persian Night looks into the actual links between the Islamic Republic and terrorist networks including al-Qaeda and Hezballah; the reality of the Iranian nuclear program; the Islamic Republic's war-making capabilities and strategies; and the origins of the three Khomeinist phobias—women, Jews, and the United States. But as Taheri demonstrates, Khomeinism is not Iran. Today there are two competing Irans: the one manifested in the negative Khomeinist energies that have dragged the nation into its dark night; the other drawing from the long and celebrated history of Persian culture while extending a friendly hand to the West. Successive U.S. administrations, along with most European governments, have failed to understand the reality of the Khomeinist regime and at times have even aided its pursuit of weapons of mass destruction, including a nuclear arsenal. Taheri provides a set of imaginative suggestions for more effective ways of dealing with Iran.

The Montauk Project - Experiments in Time
