print two copies of the mini end papers

print 16 double-sided copies of the book pages

print another 16 copies of page 1 on the back

finish cutting out the book covers

try to cut each book page accurately on the dividing line

provide each book with 43 many pages

create a fold along either side of the book spine

bend the book cover along the two folds

making the back and front covers match in length

create the rounded shape of the book spine

roll it back and forth over the skewer

bind the loose book pages

hold the pages together with two binder clips

apply the glue generously along the spine

paint the inside border of the book covers

folded the covers

define and accentuate our book spines

holding the strip along the spine measure

cut the marked strip with a pair of side cutters

attach the strip to the book spine pressing gently

pages together as tightly as possible

begin by painting the top and bottom page edges of the book

separating the gold pages

use the tips of a straight fine tipped tweezer

using gold acrylic paint on the page edges

cut a small strip approximately five millimeters wide from either one

fold the strip in half

apply glue to only one side of the cover

spread the glue evenly with the brush

wipe away any excess glue fold

attach your first block of pages

spread it evenly with a brush

attach the end paper to the other side

attach the end paper

trim the end paper diagonally where the page and spine

The process of securing the collection and making it accessible needs the mindset of a collections manager as well as the one of a project manager. The target audience are museum professionals with a basic training in collections care that are confronted with collections that are either large in numbers (1000+ artifacts) or stored confusingly,

or both. The book is a step-by-step guide how to approach this situation, assuming that there's nothing to start with but a collection that has to be accessioned and the person who is assigned to do it. It is about how to bring order into the chaos, to define what is needed in terms of time, money, staff and material, to spot facility issues and potential dangers, and to use the power of networking to solve an otherwise unsolvable task. Many chapters conclude with "logical exits," the points at which the collection in a condition that allows you to leave it for the next curator to take over. A common issue is that time frames are often so tight that the target of having the collection in good shape at the end of a contract or at a fixed date can't be met.
