The eighth chapter presents the results of the meta-analysis for the dimensions examined: grade level, duration of treatment, mode of instruction, focus of instruction, revision, and feedback. The final chapter discusses the compatibility of results of treatment or method studies with those of processes studies, and offers recommendations for future research. (HTH)

Lewis Carroll's Games and Puzzles

Mathematical Games and Pastimes focuses on numerical solutions to mathematical games and pastimes.
