"The Hope of Israel Movement aims to bring the fullness of the gospel of Jesus Christ to His brethren according to the flesh. We hold that Scriptural - not Talmudic or Rabbinical, still less Reformed - Judaism is as much as divine revelation as Christianity.

Robert Dick Wilson was a linguist who studied the Bible. Fluent in Greek, Hebrew, Aramaic and other ancient tongues, his scholarly gifts were famous in his native Pennsylvania and beyond. Part of the Presbyterian movement, he spent most of his life seeking to prove the veracity and truth of the Biblical lore.

His Truth is Marching on

This volume contains the proceedings of a Symposium "Prophecy in the Book of Jeremiah", arranged by the Edinburgh Prophecy Network in the School of Divinity at the University of Edinburgh, 11–12 May 2007. Prophetic studies are undergoing radical changes at the moment. Whereas it was formerly believed that the "historical Jeremiah" was hidden under countless additions and reinterpretations, and thus changed beyond recognition, it was still assumed that it would be possible to recover the real prophet with the tools of historical critical methods. However, according to a majority of scholars today, the recovery of the historical Jeremiah is no longer possible. For this reason, the meeting in Edinburgh gathered specialists from Denmark, Finland, Germany, the Netherlands, United Kingdom and the USA, in order to find new and different approaches to the study of prophecy.

Selected Studies on Prophetic Interpretation

To the Student of Bible Prophecy, I have studied Bible Prophecy since 1984. I have read a lot of books on prophecy and found that most of them assume you know certain basics about prophecy, so they discuss end time events and usually don't tell you the background and other information you need to know to understand what they are telling you. They give you the meat of prophecy without the milk you need to digest the big stuff. This study course gives you the background and the facts you need to understand prophecy. In other words, it takes you from the milk to the meat of the word. PURPOSE: The intent is to teach the interested about the return of the Lord Jesus Christ to this earth, to claim the victory He won on the cross, for you and me. The study does not intend to be denominational, rather it's

intent is to enlighten and to bring all of the Body of Christ, His Church, together as one. SCOPE: The scope of the study is from the beginning to the end: from Genesis to Revelation. The student is taken through the study from scratch. The study concentrates strongly on prophecy that has already been fulfilled, showing the steps leading up to today and what the Bible says will soon occur. The outline shows there are 30 Lessons arranged into 11 Lesson Sets. Each Lesson Set has a pre-test, a test, answers, Extra Information Sheets, other aides to help understanding, along with a Subject Reference in the back. It is my fervent hope that the Holy Spirit will impress upon you the need to be aware of the Lord's imminent return (Luke 21:36) and God's blessings for studying prophecy (Revelation 1:3)

Excerpt from Prophecy of Religion: Studies in the Life of Jeremiah When the Council of the Cunningham Lecture ship did me the honour of inviting me to be the Lecturer for 1920, leaving the choice of a subject to myself, I gratefully accepted the appointment, and offered a course on the life and writings of Jeremiah. Had I been younger, I should have preferred, instead of adding another to the many books on Jeremiah which have recently appeared in English, to try and break ground in some less frequented field of Old Testament theology. In general, however, the substance of the six original lectures will be found in Chapters I and II; III and IV; VIII; VI and VII; XI; XV and XVIII. The remaining nine chapters are added in order to present a fuller picture of Jeremiah (though still an incomplete one) than was possible in the lectures.
