Jules Verne's The Mysterious Island (1874) charts the adventure of a group of castaways on an uncharted South Pacific island. It's both a shipwreck adventure and a mystery. Contemporary readers would have found the greatest similarities between Verne's Mysterious Island and DeFoe's Robinson Crusoe (1719), the quintessential castaway story. But today, The Mysterious Island will resonate with anyone familiar with the television show Lost. While Lost spoilers are unforgivable, divulging the secrets of The Mysterious Island is pardonable since the novel is nearly 150 years old. Given the number of mysteries that arise during the course of the novel, only one spoiler is really necessary to explain the novel: it's a sequel to Verne's 20,000 Leagues Under the Sea (1870). The first 3D4 of the novel combine

the castaways' efforts to colonize the island and a series of unexplainable occurrences that help them along their way. The great Captain Nemo finally shows up in the last 50 pages, and his appearance explains the supernatural events.

The Mysterious Island by Jules Verne. The Mysterious Island (French: *L'Île mystérieuse*) is a novel by Jules Verne, published in 1875. The original edition, published by Hetzel, contains a number of illustrations by Jules Férat. The novel is a crossover sequel to Verne's famous *Twenty Thousand Leagues Under the Seas* (1870) and *In Search of the Castaways* (1867-68), though its themes are vastly different from those books. An early draft of the novel, initially rejected by Verne's publisher and wholly reconceived before publication, was titled *Shipwrecked Family: Marooned with Uncle Robinson*, seen as indicating the influence of the novels *Robinson Crusoe* and *The Swiss Family Robinson*. Verne developed a similar theme in his later novel, *Godfrey Morgan* (French: *L'École des Robinsons*, 1882). During the American Civil War, five Northern prisoners of war escape during the Siege of Richmond, Virginia, by hijacking a hydrogen-filled observation balloon. The escapees are Cyrus Smith, a railroad engineer in the Union army (named Cyrus Harding in Kingston's version); his ex-slave and loyal follower Neb (short for Nebuchadnezzar); Bonadventure Pencroff, a sailor (who is addressed only by his surname; in Kingston's translation, he is named Pencroft); his protégé and adopted son Harbert Brown (called Herbert in some translations); and the journalist Gédéon Spilett (Gideon Spilett in English versions). The company is completed by Cyrus' dog "Top". After flying in a great storm for several days, the group crash-lands on a cliff-bound, volcanic, unknown island, described as being located at 34°57'2S 150°30'2W, about 2,500 kilometres (1,600 mi) east of New Zealand. They name it "Lincoln Island" in honor of Abraham Lincoln. With the knowledge of the brilliant engineer Smith, the five are able to sustain themselves on the island, producing fire, pottery, bricks, nitroglycerin, iron, a simple electric telegraph, a cave home inside a stony cliff called "Granite House".
