Each stage between skin Sheds is called an instar

The 2nd instar starts to look more familiar but it s still tiny only about 7 mm to start

5th instars are eating machines! A caterpillar can consume a whole leaf in an hour or two.

The caterpillar hangs from a silk pad for about a day before pupating

When the tentacles go limp they are about to start their last ches as a caterpillar

Watch the video: Monarch Butterfly Pupation to see the entire process

Whas emerges, the pupa, looks nothing like a caterpillar!

It must attach the hooks on to hind end to the silk pad.

Then it must dislodge its old skin

The pupa settles down and slowly changes to its final shape.

The day before the butterfly will emerge its wings start to become visible
