Great Entertainers

Gottfried's salute to the great performers begins with an overview of 17th century commedia dell'arte and the rise of comedic performances, minstrel shows, pantomime and acrobatics. He then describes popular entertainment of the 19th and 20th centuries, including the age of vaudeville and burlesque. Going back to the days of vaudeville, the era of the Palace Theatre and the Roxy, Gottfried recaptures with photographs, the great acts of early times--the comic dialogues of Weber and Fields or Smith and Dale, lyrics made famous by Sophie Tucker or Rudy Vallee, Flo Ziegfeld's "Follies," and the feats of Harry Houdini and Doug Henning. The Great Entertainers

BackStage is a raucously funny, narrative non-fiction compilation of stories, tales, and gems from the Golden Era of entertainment circa 1960 - 1980. The stories are told by the bass trombonist who played in the Tommy Dorsey band, with Frank Sinatra and later toured with Elvis' Orchestra into the Rock & Roll era and to his end. Marty Harrell was also the best friend and roommate of Frank Sinatra Jr. through their Tommy Dorsey years. The book is filled with tales of the brightest stars of the greatest era of music entertainment during the nascent days of television and new media, and provides a personal perspective of this behind the scenes character - who unknowingly bears witness to the most beloved of the era. Moreover, not only are films such as *Top Hat* (1935) and *Shall We Dance* (1937) cornerstones of the musical, but one of the great achievements of the Fred and Ginger team is that they never fell out of public favor. Indeed, the completeness of the Fred and Ginger pairing was punctuated by the fact that there was no bitter

breakup between them, making it so that audiences are left only with the seamless screen romances between them. Considering the immense success of their films together, it is entirely understandable that Astaire and Rogers are joined at the hip in the eyes of the public. However, an appreciation for the Fred and Ginger musicals is only enhanced by knowledge of the personal backgrounds of the two stars. After all, the fact remains that Astaire and Rogers came from vastly different cultural backgrounds, and at the time that they met, their careers had unfolded in dissimilar ways. Astaire was a national celebrity for his skills as a stage performer (mainly with his sister Adele), while Rogers was raised in a more archetypal Midwestern setting and her professional success was reached entirely through cinema. While Astaire made a name for himself through his dancing, Rogers was more recognized for her singing talents. Clearly, it is still possible to discern fundamental differences between their professional talents, contrasts that would become more distinguishable once they ceased making films together. Most of Maugham's works could be adapted to satisfy the tastes of moviegoers and the demands of the Hays Office censors, if not the expectations of their author.
