Of Dreams and Dreamers

Shame and acceptance, love and loss, life and death. These dichotomies of being are at the heart of Joseph Leahey's LGBTQ+ experience and this volume of collected poems. The Dreamer and the Dreamed: Collected Poems of Joseph Leahey Vol. 1 navigates the poet's evolution starting with his tumultuous, life-changing artistic self-discovery in the early 1980s. They consider the ways altered states of mind and dream consciousness influence life and art. Film, popular music, and literary icons infuse these words with rhythm, style, and musicality. They illustrate the ways different forms of expression and lyricism inspire the poet. Readers will recognize the influences C.P. Cavafy, Edna St. Vincent Millay, and James Baldwin, among others. Poetry lovers will enjoy the breadth of scope in this collection. From astrological phenomena and spirituality to homoeroticism and death, The Dreamer and the Dreamed reveals the complicated experiences of existence.

The Romantic Dream

In Part Four, Resurrected Dreams, I write about the death and resurrection of

the American Dream, and how by enduring our tests and trials, we can create works of art that inspire others. In this, we dreamers find our immortality, our humanity, and our divinity. Some of the poems shared in the book are award-winning, but most of all, I hope that these poems open the minds and touch the hearts of all who read them.
