The Words of the Risen Saviour

Excerpt from The Words of the Risen Saviour: And Commentary on the Epistle of St. James This last passage teaches us further that the ascension, as the final consummating point of the exaltation of Jesus, must, notwithstanding all this, maintain its place. We denounce the blasphemy of those who, with Brennecke, Of melancholy memory, fable that Christ lived upon earth twenty-seven years after His

crucifixion, planning all kinds of appearances to His disciples; as well as the theory of Kinkel, which has found too much favour with the learned, that there was no real ascension after the resurrection. The different manner in which the Lord appeared and spoke, after His visible ascension, of itself establishes the distinction most firmly; apart from the authentic narrative of that event, and the subsequent doctrine founded upon it. For, although St Paul, according to his essentially correct system, ordinarily gives prominence only to the resurrection (with its infolded results) as the definite point of transition between the humiliation and exaltation of Christ - even as the Church kept Easter first, and only afterwards added the festival of the Ascension - yet the same Apostle speaks abundantly of the Redeemer's session at the right hand of God in heaven (Eph. I. 20, etc., iv. 10; comp. Heb. iv. 14, viii. 1, ix. In the same manner as St Peter does, 1 Pet. iii. 22. Excerpt from The Words of the Risen Saviour: And Commentary on the Epistle of St. James When the Apostle Paul in 1 Cor. xv.8 places the appearance of the risen and exalted Jesus to himself in direct continuation with the earlier appearances of the Forty Days - without making express mention of the ascension - it might appear that he recognises no distinction between the time before, and the time after, that event; and the meaning which he intended to convey is undoubtedly this, that the same Person who, from the moment of His resurrection, had begun to enter into His glory, after His suffering and death, had appeared and said to him I - am this Jesus, Still more striking, and equally important in its bearing, is the fact that Ananias, in Acts xxii.14, 15, places the seeing and hearing to which St Paul was chosen, on a level with that seeing and hearing which (according to ch. i.21, 22) was the qualification of one who should be a witness to all men of that which he had seen and heard that is, of an Apostle. The Lord's life of humiliation and His life of glory are here really embraced in one comprehensive glance; hence, Ananias used the same expression, the Just One, which Stephen used in ch. vii.52. All this emphatically teaches us that the transaction with the Apostle Paul must be classed among those manifestations of our Lord which, notwithstanding the intervening glorification in heaven, were bodily manifestations. The Sanctus in the Eucharistic Prayer

Prayers of the Eucharist

This study proceeds historically, from the origins of the Eucharist up to our own day. Unlike most studies of this kind, it includes an introduction to and developmental summary of the diverse Eucharistic liturgies of the Christian East. It also explores the various Western rites (Ambrosian, Gallican, and Mozarabic) in addition to the Roman. With regard to theological themes, the authors give special attention to the topics of real presence (including the "consecration" of the bread and wine) and eucharistic sacrifice, the most central and most ecumenically challenging issues since the sixteenth-century Reformations. Making the book especially teacher- and student-friendly are the summary points at the end of each chapter. Each chapter also contains an abundance of liturgical texts for ease of reference.

The Eucharistic Liturgies

In the light of its own history, the Catholic theology of the Eucharist, as it is generally understood today, is revealed as a splinter tradition whose deficiencies call for fundamental reformulation. The valid aspects of that theology (for example, the recovery of the role of the Holy Spirit in the new Roman Eucharistic Prayers) must be identified and integrated with the faith and practice of the first theological millennium when the *lex orandi* was not so dominated by the *lex credendi*. In the third theological millennium, more attention to the content and structure of the classical Eucharistic Prayers of both East and West will result in a Catholic systematic theology of eucharistic sacrifice that is not only truer to its biblical and patristic foundations but also - of ecumenical import - closer to some of the theological insights of the Protestant Reformers. These highlights of *The Eucharist in the West* illustrate the great value of this posthumous work. Conceptually complete, but in only rough draft form at the time of Father Kilmartin's death, it has been edited and prepared for publication by Robert J. Daly, SJ Chapter one describes the characteristics of the eucharistic theology of the Western Latin Fathers. Chapter two identifies the more important orientations and developments of the Catholic tradition from early medieval Scholasticism up to the first part of the twelfth century. Chapter three singles out the special contribution of early Scholasticism to Latin eucharistic theology. Chapter four functions as a bridge from early Scholasticism to high Scholasticism by outlining the general approach to a synthetic theology of the Eucharist which was obtained at the beginning of the thirteenth century. Chapter five treats eucharistic theology from high Scholasticism to the Council of Trent. Chapter six summarizes the dogmatic teaching of the Council of Trent. This is followed in Chapter seven, by a treatment of salient features of post-Tridentine Eucharistic theology. Chapter eight includes an analysis of the practice and theology of Mass stipends. Chapter nine includes a detailed analysis of Aquinas's theology of the eucharistic sacrifice. Chapter ten offers an account of some recent contributions to the formulation of a theology of the eucharistic sacrifice which have contributed to the modern average Roman Catholic synthesis. Robert J. Daly, SJ, is a professor of theology at Boston College and former editor of *Theological Studies*. Edward J. Kilmartin, SJ (1923-1994), professor for liturgical theology at the Pontifical Oriental Institute in Rome,

taught theology first at the Weston Jesuit School of Theology and later at Boston College. He served as director of the doctoral program in liturgical studies at the University of Notre Dame.

The Eucharistic Prayers from the Roman Missal Arranged for Concelebration

In this critical analysis Enrico Mazza concentrates on structure as he traces the evolution of the Eucharistic Prayer from its origins in the ancient Jewish rites and its Christian beginnings in the Didache. He then examines the paleoanaphoras of the early centuries and moves through the origin and progressive development of the larger anaphoric families (Alexandrian, Roman, Antiochene), showing the influence of the Jewish rites on the formation of the Christian texts, and arriving finally at the classical anaphoras of the fourth century.

The Eucharist in the West

The Roman Rite has evolved over the centuries in very diverse contexts and situations, and it has endured to our own day precisely because of its capacity to adapt and be shaped by the distinct cultures where it has been celebrated. In 2002 the Latin third edition of the *Missale Romanum* was promulgated and in subsequent years episcopal conferences have been busy at work producing vernacular translations of that Latin text. As the English-speaking world prepares to receive and implement the English translation of the Missal, Dr. Pecklers' book is offered as an instrument of catechesis in helping clergy and laity alike to better grasp the rationale for the new translations by considering the wider context of the Rite itself. Keith F. Pecklers, SJ, is professor of liturgy at the Pontifical Gregorian University and professor of liturgical history at the Pontifical Liturgical Institute in Rome.
