The second novel, "Gold in the Sky" is Alan E. Nourse's grand novel of betrayal and murder among the asteroid miners. First published in the September, 1958 issue of *Amazing Stories*. Greg and Tom Hunter were devastated when they learned of their father's death in the Asteroid Belt. Although it was labeled as an "accident," both were sure that foul play was involved. They were certain that Jupiter Equilateral, a big deep space mining corporation, was behind their father's death. Unfortunately, being "certain" and being able to "prove it" were two different things. So when they voiced their suspicions

to the proper space authorities they were told that, without evidence, there was nothing that could be done. The Hunter brothers then took the only course of action left to them; to investigate on their own and get the evidence needed to bring their father's killer to justice. They soon found themselves embroiled in a life-and-death adventure in the wilds of the asteroid belt.
