The first vecindades were built by wealthy Spanish colonists in a traditional Andalusian style in the 16th century.

Rooms spanned multiple stories around an open-air courtyard

The homes were anywhere from two to five stories tall, built on narrow lots out of stone or brick The patio was the heart of the home, with large windows in each room overlooking it both for aesthetics and to keep air moving.

The 1800s brought industrialization and social and political upheaval

As workers moved in, the individual rooms around the courtyard transformed into cramped apartments.

Today, some vecindades survive as cafes, shops, hotels, storage and sometimes middle-income housing.
