Also known as "Dr. Eliot's Five Foot Shelf," it represented Eliot's belief that a basic liberal education could be gleaned by reading from an anthology of works that could fit on five feet of bookshelf. Volume V features two collections from American poet and philosopher RALPH WALDO EMERSON (1803-1882): Essays on such topics as "The American Scholar," "Self-Reliance," "Friendship," "Heroism," and more—and English Traits, in which he examines the British character as gathered from his travels in England.
