The Devil's Interval, formally known as the tritone, is a highly dissonant musical interval encompassing three whole tones. Historically considered unsettling and even 'forbidden' in medieval music, it represents either an augmented fourth or a diminished fifth. This unique and challenging sound has been employed throughout musical history to evoke tension, unease, or dramatic effect in compositions.
