A Ghost in My Mirror

Knowing how inter-ethnic relationships sometimes meet strong resistance from either families, especially in a culturally sensitive society, what would an additional social stigma do to worsen the situation? That, in a nutshell, is the gist of this novel. *A Ghost In My Mirror*, is the story of two young Nigerians who suffer so much anguish on the basis of their culturally checkered background: One is the daughter of a northerner, and the other is the son of a notorious armed robber. Yemi Samuel is the daughter of a Yoruba woman and a Fulani father. Her mother dies in childbirth, and she has no idea who her father is because she is brought up in the household of her mother's older sister, Auntie Aduke; a very successful textile merchant who flees the north during the civil war following the untimely death of her younger sister, Sarah and their parents. Enitan Mosadi is a London-based medical intern and the only child of a notorious armed robber who is publicly executed at the Bar Beach. Auntie Aduke vows to sabotage the relationship, and in spite of all odds, Yemi is resolute and continues the affair. The result is anybody's guess.

Ghosts, spirits, and specters have played important roles in narratives throughout history and across nations and cultures.
