Then, there was another provision which declared that the records, acts and judicial decisions of any State should be valid in all the States, thus nationalizing the records, acts and judicial decisions of any one. As has been remarked, the Articles were of value in that they served as a common legislative document to all the States and as a suggestion for a future, more effective Constitution. But as a real Constitution, the Articles were practically worthless. They provided neither for a Supreme Court to interpret the laws, nor for an Executive to enforce them; and the provision for a Congress of only one House where each State had but a single vote without regard to its population and in essence was also a weakness in their efficiency.
