Fundamentals of the Faith

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Church History Books 1-10

This book, written by a retired pastor/Bible college professor is an accessible reading companion and study guide for Paul's letter to the Ephesians. The author is evangelically conservative and works with non-Calvinistic convictions. While the author respects and appreciates recent critical research into the origins and nature of Ephesians, his writing style should seem quite understandable for the average church person. The study guides after each chapter contain extra research suggestions as well as a variety of questions and ideas for group discussion. The book can be used for personal study and devotions or for group work. The author does not use the typical verse-by-verse approach that many commentaries use, but deals with each paragraph with a flowing narrative-type explanation. The aim of the book is to enrich the student's life with a clearer understanding of Ephesians, the basic Biblical document on the nature of the church of Christ.

Jesus the Christ Study Guide

The classic *Harmony of the Gospels* by J. W. McGarvey and Philip Y. Pendleton with interspersed comments. Attractively re-typeset, this enduring work is a valuable resource to modern Bible students. "In most commentaries a fifth or sixth of the space is taken up in drawing distinctions between the texts of the four Gospels, while in this work these distinctions are placed before the reader's eye, where he can see them for himself at a glance. Moreover, in other commentaries, which give the text, another sixth or seventh of the work is taken up in reprinting in the notes that portion of the text concerning which the commentator wishes to speak. Our interjected method avoids all this needless repetition, and makes it possible for us to present the comment with the least preliminary verbiage or introductory setting. Time is also saved because the reader does not have to look back and forth from the text at the top to the comment at the bottom of the page. Again, other commentaries lose a large amount of space by using the King James text. Those which preceded the revision waste space correcting the translation and modernizing its English: those published since the revision suffer a similar waste by drawing endless comparisons between the two texts. By choosing the American revision as the basis for our work, we have a text which needs but little explanation or apology, and we are thereby enabled to employ the reader's time and strength to his best advantage." --Excerpted from the Introduction

The Anatomy of a Church

This book will give the reader a better understanding and appreciation for the twelve apostles. It is biblically based and includes many scriptural references. We learn from this study that God uses ordinary, average men to accomplish great things for Him. These disciples had their faults and failures, their strengths and weaknesses, their victories and defeats just like we do. They were special men chosen by our Lord Jesus Christ.

Strength for Today

"God is love." It's the most basic definition of God in Scriptures, but so profound that it's often misunderstood. In this probing book, a brilliant Bible expositor brings us into the very heart of God by answering such questions as: If God is love, how could He send anyone to hell? What's the difference between the loving God of the New Testament and the angry God of the Old Testament? If God is love, why did He require His Son to die such a cruel death on the Cross? How can God be both loving and jealous? The author argues against the two polar views of God as a sentimental grandfather whose doting love could not bring him to punishment of the disobedient and God as an angry tyrant who would rule by threats. "Both extremes paint a distorted picture of God and further confuse the issue of understanding God's love," Dr. MacArthur writes. He insists that what God loves is actually defined by what He hates, and that neither His love nor His wrath can be understood in isolation from the other. Although the author is clearly aware of the way great men have grappled with these issues in the history of the Church, his doctrinal presentations arise more from the biblical text than from dogmatic theology. He examines in detail the way John—"the apostle of love"—treats love in his First Epistle, then fleshes out the doctrine of God's love in vivid representations of real people interacting with divine love.
