adding the optical tape

collected down into the bottom of a tube

set up the reactions

put in how many samples

heat the sample to 95 degrees for five minutes

take a picture of the fluorescence

make a standard curve by doing a dilution series of a plasmid

use this in a dilution series
put 45 microliters of salmon sperm dna into each of the dilution
rinse the tip
balance the microfuge
rinsing the tip
put your dilution series on ice
using the platinum qpcr super mix
purchase an aliquot into small tubes
wicking down the side of the tube
pushed my thumb down to the first stop
dispense into very small tubes
invert the tube a few times
add your five microliters of template to your reactions
get the tip wet by measuring up and down a few times
put your wetted tip into the reaction mix
dispensing five microliters of our template into each of these wells
cover up parts of the plate
rip off a strip of cellophane tape
put the tip just past the surface of the the dna sample
touch the side of the tube of the well with the tip
put the caps on
move on to adding the templates for our standard curves
adding roughly five copies of my target per reaction
place it in the spinner
forces the bubbles up to the top
read at the end of the 58 degree cycles
start to heat the plate up to 95 degrees
label these with the number of copies
put 5 microliters of that into our reaction
ran 45 cycles of the reaction
establishing a limit of detection
switch the scales from logarithmic to linear
export all of the raw data

This argument is substantiated in a series of compelling and well-grounded case studies. Through his exploration of science fiction and film, AIDS research, the French experience with the "information superhighway," and the Japanese reception of Western values, he demonstrates how technology, when subjected to public pressure and debate, can incorporate ethical and aesthetic values.

The Face Of Battle

What role do metaphors play in philosophical language? Are they impediments to clear thinking and clear expression, rhetorical flourishes that may well help to make philosophy more accessible to a lay audience, but that ought ideally to be eradicated in the interests of terminological exactness? Or can the images used by philosophers tell us more about the hopes and cares, attitudes and indifferences that regulate an epoch than their carefully elaborated systems of thought? In *Paradigms for a Metaphorology*, originally published in 1960 and here made available for the first time in English translation, Hans Blumenberg (1920-1996) approaches these questions by examining the relationship between metaphors and concepts. Blumenberg argues for the existence of "absolute metaphors" that cannot be translated back into conceptual language. "Absolute metaphors" answer the supposedly naïve, theoretically unanswerable questions whose relevance lies quite simply in the fact that they cannot be brushed aside, since we do not pose them ourselves but find them already posed in the ground of our existence. They leap into a void that concepts are unable to fill. An afterword by the translator, Robert Savage, positions the book in the intellectual context of its time and explains its continuing importance for work in the history of ideas.

European Finance at the Emergency Test

This book discusses issues of broad cultural consequence by examining the work of three of Italy's most prominent living novelists, Umberto Eco, Vincenzo Consolo, and Antonio Tabucchi. The introductory chapter continues a discussion of some of the topics already broached in the author's *Narrating*

Postmodern Time and Space (1997). It uses an approach that is both historicist and psychoanalytic to critically address topics in cultural studies and Italian studies. The book deals with fictions of very recent publication, many of which have been published after the turn of the millennium, filling important gaps in the critical bibliography. Close readings relate texts to their historical and cultural contexts, critiquing their ideology while preserving their Utopian moments.

One can often encounter an opinion that Polish scientific (or analytic) philosophy (or the Lvov-Warsaw School) deserves to be much better known than actually is. This book is thought as a response to such a claim. The papers collected in this volume are divided into two parts: Background and Influence and History and Systematics. However, there is no sharp borderline between themes which are touched in both parts. Generally speaking, all papers of the first part relate the Lvov-Warsaw School to some philosophical movements (Brentanism, phenomenology and Marxism) external to it whereas the papers collected in the second one focus on internal issues connected with the school (only Roberto Poli takes into account Brentano's views in his discussion of reism). Since the Polish school of mathematical logic is much better known than the Polish analytic philosophy we decided to omit here any treatment of the former. Thus, this collection centers on purely philosophical matters. We projected this volume not as an exhaustive panorama of Polish analytic philosophy but rather as a series of essays on particular persons or topic. As a result one can find here papers on Twardowski, Ajdukiewicz, Kotarbinski, Tarski and Lukasiewicz as well as on ethics on science, nominalism, and the methodology of psychology. We hope that this book will contribute to a better knowledge and evaluation of Polish achievements in analytic philosophy. We would like to express our gratitude to Professor Leszek Nowak, the editor-in-chief of *Poznan Studies in the Philosophy of the Sciences and the Humanities*, who initiated the idea of the collection and helped in its preparation.
