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High on Life, with Horses

Description of my book "High On Life, With Horses" My book consists of three parts, the first, "Flame and I," begins as a Memoir following my parent's divorce when I was 12. When I was 14 years old, I was living with my aunt and uncle on a farm near Gilliam, Missouri, near the Missouri River. At this time, my paternal grandfather gave me an unbroken four year old horse he had bought for me 3 years earlier (and kept at a friend's place near Miami, Missouri) unknown to me. When presented to me, I named him Flame and we became best friends. When I was sixteen, I was forced to move to Kansas City to live with my mother and go to high school there. Everyone agreed I could come back every other week-end to ride my beloved horse. This was another turbulent time for me, but I persevered, graduated and went to work at Hallmarks in the art department. On December 27, 1956, my Marine, Dale Bryan, and I were married. I was still going to see my horse every other week-end. When Dale was discharged, we moved to the country and I finally had Flame with me. In 1965, we, with our two small sons, Flame and a pony, moved to our farm, north of Chilhowee, Missouri, and I became a farm wife. In the 1970's I met other women who rode and camped with their horses. We became the very best of friends and called ourselves The Saddle Bags. Suddenly, my memoir wasn't just about me, but all the women I was now riding with. Horsey adventures abound, some sadness, too, but we women are definitely "High On Life, With Horses." We have great escapades and so much fun. (Meanwhile, I became a professional artist.) Bees, baby bobcats, bicycles, ticks, long horns, stinging nettles, snake bite, fawns, dogs, emus, loose donkeys, and floods are only a few of the things we encountered through-out the second part of my book. Bad things happened, too; we lost one of our Saddle Bags in a horse-related accident. Not to mention, I almost wrecked my truck and new trailer with two horses inside! Another time, we were 40 miles south of Joplin, on a ride at Pineville, when the huge tornado hit Joplin. When we left early the next morning, we had to skirt around the east side of Joplin to get to US71 Highway and saw so much desolation and destruction. There were more funny incidences, though, than sad ones. For instance, "A Senile Old Woman" - "She's Ruined" - "Does Anybody Have Any Preparation H cream?" - "Nat Saying Good-bye to April." In 1999, I also began riding with The Desperate Horse Wives, who were mostly day riders. Every Thursday was set aside as our day to ride. These women hail from around the Clinton and Appleton City area. There were some real "dyed in the wool" women riders in this group,

but, all in all, they weren't quite as adventurous as The Saddle Bags. I rode with The Saddle Bags, and The Desperate Horse Wives until I gave up riding at age 75. Most of this group submitted appealing stories of their first horse or pony, included in this third section. "Martha's Blue Racer" will surely make you laugh, as will " 'Step Along Now, Fella' " - "He Won't Leave the Other Horses" and "Oops! My Saddle Turned." We encountered llamas, bees, an opossum, and snakes. Horse accidents happened. Husbands accused of having "Short Rides, Long Lunches." (It's because of all the gourmet cooks we have and our lively conversations.) Nat regularly reminded us that we could be working on the chicken line at Tyson's instead of riding our horses and having so much fun together. We women cherished our time together and with our horses. So, as you can tell, if you don't like horses...this book's not for you!

Mr Darley's Arabian

Shortlisted for the William Hill Sports Book of the Year Award In 1704 a bankrupt English merchant sent home the colt he had bought from Bedouin tribesmen near the ruins of Palmyra. Thomas Darley hoped this horse might be the ticket to a new life back in Yorkshire. But he turned out to be far more than that: and although Mr Darley's Arabian never ran a race, 95% of all thoroughbreds in the world today are descended from him. In this book, for the first time, award-winning racing writer Christopher McGrath traces this extraordinary bloodline through twenty-five generations to our greatest modern racehorse, Frankel. The story of racing is about man's relationship with horses, and Mr Darley's Arabian also celebrates the men and women who owned, trained and traded the stallions that extended the dynasty. The great Eclipse, for instance, was bred by the Duke who foiled Bonnie Prince Charlie's invasion (with militia gathered from Wakefield races) and went on to lead the Jockey Club. But he only became a success once bought and raced by a card-sharp and brothel-keeper - the racecourse has always brought high and low life together. McGrath expertly guides us through three centuries of scandals, adventures and fortunes won and lost: our sporting life offers a fascinating view into our history. With a canvas that extends from the diamond mines of South Africa to the trenches of the Great War, and a cast ranging from Smithfield meat salesmen to the inspiration for Mr Toad, and from legendary jockeys to not one, but two disreputable Princes of Wales (and a very unamused Queen Victoria), Mr Darley's Arabian shows us the many faces of the sport of kings.

They demonstrate stereotypical behaviours, like weaving and crib-biting, associated with confinement and stress. The supplement market is awash with calming powders and digestive health remedies. Equine vets are busy investigating mystery lameness and treating sports horses for gastric ulcers. What if we could keep our beloved horses in a way that is governed by their needs, rather than our convenience? What if we could offer horses a life that fulfils their needs for friends, forage, and freedom, as well as our goals and desires? This seems a fair exchange in return for allowing us to share their grace and beauty. A healthy, happy, and sound horse would be a partner in a dream come true. Fran McNicol bought her first horse at the age of 32. She was a surgical trainee, with a good salary, and an aspiration to compete in amateur one-day eventing. Paddy was a dark bay, almost black, a good jumper and an elegant mover, with a troubled past. He didn't know what apples or carrots were for, didn't much like cuddles, and was generally suspicious of humans. And he hated the whole process of being shod. She tried to work with him because after all, horses need shoes to be ridden? don't they?

Run With a Mighty Heart

HORSES FOR LIFE

Richard Dunwoody was the most successful steeplechase jockey of his time. During his fantastic career, he rode over 10,000 times, often partnering the top National Hunt horses such as Desert Orchid and Miinnehoma. His staggering collection of 1,699 wins in Britain has earned him professional respect and a string of accolades including an MBE. In this fascinating book, Dunwoody remembers the great horses he has ridden and the high points of his remarkable career. In 1986 he rode to victory in the Grand National on West Tip and repeated this triumph in 1994 on Miinnehoma. It was with One Man that he won two consecutive King George VI chases. Although his career was full of memorable partnerships and victories, it is for riding Desert Orchid that Dunwoody is best remembered. 'Dessie' was a hugely popular horse - apart from Red Rum, he was the only racehorse with a fan club - and the pair rode their way to a remarkable seven victories. Yet despite his big race victories, his determination and ambition remained constant, driving him on to even greater achievements. In a book full of stories, anecdotes and opinions, Richard tells not only of the glory surrounding his career but also of the hard work involved in achieving that glory: the struggle to ensure that both horse and rider were at their peak on race day; the pitfalls and the setbacks endured; and the quirks and characteristics of some of the finest horses in this tough sport.
