The Fourth Gospel Reports that the Crowd Hailed Him as King of Israel Apparently His Followers Still Thought of Him as a Political Messiah Who Would Overthrow the Roman Power and Make Judea Supreme It Was these Acclamations That Doomed Christ to a Revolutionists Death Five Days later at the Transfiguration the Feast of the Passover Was at Hand and Great Numbers of Jews for Gathering in Jerusalem To Offer Sacrifice in the Temple the Outer Court of the Shrine Was Noisy with Vendors Selling Doves and Other Sacrificial Animals and with Money Changers Offering Locally Acceptable Currency for the Idolatrous Coins of the Roman Realm Visiting the Temple on the Day after His Entry into the City Jesus Was Shocked by the Clamor and Commercialism of the Booths
