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Kunst und Leben - ein Roman

"The whole world is a picture, writes Austrian photographer Paul Albert Leitner in the first line of his photographic ""novel"". A remarkable grab bag of images - from bucolic nature to a discarded Christmas tree, construction debris to the creamy thighs of a female nude - come together to describe the artist's world. Leitner writes: ""An old lady observes. A monkey copulates. They are happy in Berlin... In Paris they meet Santa Claus who gives them his garter belt. The Daiquiri tastes like a glacier and they cite Hemingway in Havana.""

Photographic Travel Books

Since early in its history, photography has been used by a diversity of travellers, whose collected photographs have been compiled into albums. But Photographic Travel as a genre of art did not appear before the second half of the twentieth century, and had a singular fate and fortune in the US as well as in Europe. The initial objective of some itinerant photographers is to make a book; their shooting practice is conditioned by this objective, as well as their travel experience. Their books – designed as one coherent hole – refer to their wandering experience, even though their stories are never completely free from fiction. In these books, their travels are converged, and their subjectivity is revealed. It is therefore relevant to call such books made of photographs, and possibly words about the travel experience, Photographic Travel books (comparably to Travel books). Danièle Méaux has tackled the task of characterizing this genre.

Wien im Bild

First published in Germany in 1929, *The End and the Beginning* is a lively personal memoir of a vanished world and of a rebellious, high-spirited young woman's struggle to achieve independence. Born in 1883 into a distinguished and wealthy aristocratic family of the old Austro-Hungarian Empire, Hermynia Zur Muhlen spent much of her childhood travelling in Europe and North Africa with her diplomat father. After five years on her German husband's estate in czarist Russia she broke with both her family and her husband and set out on a precarious career as a professional writer committed to socialism. Besides translating many leading contemporary authors, notably Upton Sinclair, into German, she herself published an impressive number of politically engaged novels, detective stories, short stories, and children's fairy tales. Because of her outspoken opposition to National Socialism, she had to flee her native Austria in 1938 and seek refuge in England, where she died, virtually penniless, in 1951. This revised and corrected translation of Zur Muhlen's memoir - with extensive notes and an essay on the author by Lionel Gossman - will appeal especially to readers interested in women's history, the Central European aristocratic world that came to an end with the First World War, and the culture and politics of the late nineteenth and early twentieth centuries.

Using a technique, which he has since patented, Ramirez projects films onto a circular, slightly convex, wooden panel, which he has gilded by hand in an elaborate process, leaf by leaf and layer by layer. This creates a unique projection surface, which determines the form of the projected images. In this debut artist book, an entire lifetime of dreaming in light is condensed to display a process unique to the California-born artist, whom Wim Wenders considers 'a true 21st century Renaissance artist.'

Lebt und arbeitet in Wien III

This dictionary identifies more than 13,000 German-Jewish surnames from the area that was pre-World War I Germany. From Baden-Wuerttemberg in the south to Schleswig-Holstein in the north. From Westfalen in the west to East Prussia in the east. In addition to providing the etymology and variants of each name, it identifies where in the region the name appeared, identifying the town and time period. More than 300 sources were used to compile the book. A chapter provides the Jewish population in many towns in the 19th century.

Deutsche Nationalbibliographie und Bibliographie der im Ausland erschienenen deutschsprachigen Veröffentlichungen

This publication presents a comprehensive overview of Michael Landy's complete works. Michael Landy (b. 1963) belongs to the group of Young British Artists, who, beginning in 1988, caused an international sensation. He created installations, in which real life and fiction entered into an unsettling liaison. With his works, he raises essential (unspoken) questions: How does the ownership of material objects affect us? What do we need to live? But also: How creative is destruction?

FF Südtiroler illustrierte

Über 70 Jahre lang – von 1788 bis 1859 – verfasste Alexander von Humboldt zahlreiche Monographien, Hunderte von Aufsätzen und Tausende von Briefen. Erstmals untersucht diese Studie den literargeschichtlichen Kontext dieser schriftstellerischen Karriere. Wie Humboldt das Schreiben erlernte, welchen Vorbildern er nacheiferte, in welchen Gattungen (vom fiktionalen Brief über die didaktische Erzählung bis zum Reisebericht und der kulturhistorischen Abhandlung) er sich übte, welches Publikum er ansprach, welchen Problemen er als Autor in verschiedenen Sprachen und bei Übersetzungen begegnete und wie er schließlich, mit den Ansichten der Natur, den Ideen zu einer Geographie der Pflanzen und vor allem mit dem Kosmos seinen Ruhm als deutscher Nationalautor zu begründen suchte. Bis zuletzt blieb der prominente Kosmopolit den Traditionen der deutschen Aufklärung und Weimarer Klassik verpflichtet. Seine Bücher faszinieren bis heute, weil er versuchte, empirische Naturforschung und idealistische Bildung zu vereinbaren und bei aller Spezialisierung des Wissens die Natur als Ganzes zu fassen. Hinter diesen heroischen Versuchen – so macht das Buch plausibel – steht viel mehr als ein gedanklicher Entwurf, nämlich die unermüdliche literarische Praxis und die professionelle Arbeit eines „gelehrten Schriftstellers“, als der Humboldt sich zeitlebens verstand.
