Symons's Monthly Meteorological Magazine

Professor Lillich has studied medieval stained glass - the major painting medium of the Gothic era - for forty years. The articles in this volume discuss the development of stained glass in France from many perspectives, such as the glaziers who produced it, specific glazing techniques and formats of design, evidence of the use of cartoons, types and uses of grisaille and its stylistic development, regional traditions in style, iconography and hagiography, as well as patrons and patronage, often with a particular focus on specifically monastic characteristics, requirements and achievements. Also considered are displaced panels, those dispersed to museums as well as spolia reused in later glazing campaigns and the reasons for such recycling. Of particular interest is the development of stained glass in the late Capetian period, from the aftermath of the High Gothic ensembles of Chartres and Bourges until the introduction of the revolutionizing technique of silver stain in the early fourteenth century. Areas of special importance are those that developed in parallel to the royal style associated with the Ile- de-France: the western French regions of Normandy and Aquitaine as well as, to the east, Lorraine at the francophone border and the county of Champagne.

The text spirals out into a fractured anatomy of melancholy that includes critical reflections on the likes of Roland Barthes, Louise Bourgeois, Henry Darger, Theresa Hak Kyung Cha, Peter Handke, and others. Zambreno has modeled the book's formless form on Bourgeois's *Cells* sculptures—at once channeling the volatility of autobiography, pain, and childhood, yet hemmed by a solemn sense of entering ritualistic or sacred space. Neither memoir, essay, nor poetry, *Book of Mutter* is an uncategorizable text that draws upon a repertoire of genres to write into and against silence. It is a haunted text, an accumulative archive of myth and memory that seeks its own undoing, driven by crossed desires to resurrect and exorcise the past. Zambreno weaves a complex web of associations, relics, and references, elevating the prosaic scrapbook into a strange and intimate postmortem/postmodern theater.

Fifty Key Classical Authors

In Miletus, about 550 B.C., together with our world-picture cosmology was born. This book tells the story. In Part One the reader is introduced in the archaic world-picture of a flat earth with the cupola of the celestial vault onto which the celestial bodies are attached. One of the subjects treated in that context is the riddle of the tilted celestial axis. This part also contains an extensive chapter on archaic astronomical instruments. Vallianatos explains how and why Greek scientists employed advanced engineering in translating the beautiful conception of the Antikythera Mechanism into an astronomical computer of genius: a bronze-gear device of mathematical astronomy, predicting the eclipses of the Sun and the Moon; calculating the risings and settings of important stars and constellations, and the movements of the planets around the Sun; while mechanizing the predictions of scientific theories. This attempt to bridge the two literary cultures is continued in *A People's Poetry*.

AntigoneKefala is one of the elders of Australian poetry, highly regarded for the intensity of her vision, yet not widely known, on account of the small number of poems she has published, each carefully worked, each magical or menacing in its effects. *Fragments* is her first collection of new poems in almost twenty years, since the publication of *New and Selected Poems* in 1998, and possibly her last. AntigoneKefala has written four works of fiction, including *The First Journey*, *The Island* and *Summer Visit*, and four poetry collections, *The Alien*, *Thirsty Weather*, *European Notebook* and *Absence: New and Selected Poems* as well as the non-fiction work *Sydney Journals*. Born in Romania of Greek parents, she lived in Greece and New Zealand before coming to Sydney.

This collection of poems and translations changes continually in its images and perspectives. It is both peaceful and disturbed, like fragments of classical poetry cut up and reassembled. Cai Tianxin's own name comes from a poem. He was born on 3 March 1963, and his father who knew classical poetry well chose his name from a poem by Du Fu, which starts on an uncharacteristic note of celebration: On March 3 the weather is new At the water's edge of Chang An There are many beautiful women 'Tian' means 'weather' or 'day' and 'xin' means 'new', so 'tianxin' can be read as 'fine weather' but also as 'every day new'. ('Chang An' is the ancient name of Xi'an - in the Tang dynasty, the capital of China.) In Cai Tianxin's words: "I have always believed that a real poet or artist need not necessarily be knowledgeable, but he has to have the need to breathe fresh air... the travels of a poet are full of freedom, ecstasy and solitude." Cai Tianxin was born in 1963 in Huangyan on the southeast coast of China. His father insisted he study sciences because he felt it was an occupation that couldn't be politically compromised. He is a professor of mathematics at Zhejiang University in Hangzhou, and an author of many books of poetry, essays, travel writing and biography. His poems have been translated into thirteen languages. In an essay, titled *Mathematicians and Poets* he wrote, 'Mathematics is a true language, which not only records and expresses ideas and the process of thinking, but also creates itself (through its own poets and writers)'.

There is something pathetic about this twist on the vicar's countenance: his eyes are so shrewd and sad. It would be hard to get near to Mr Colbran. Indeed, now, his soul had some of the twist of his face, so that, when he is not ironical, he is satiric. Yet a man of more complete tolerance and generosity scarcely exists. Let the boors mock him, he merely smiles on the other side, and there is no malice in his eyes, only a quiet expression of waiting till they have finished. His people do not like him, yet none could bring forth an accusation against him, save, that "You never can tell when he's having you."

By the time she was eight, Lundyn knew that important things get broken. She spent years trying to forget the missing fragments until she realized that restoration, or just the attempt, is necessary. She learned that scattered pieces can take years to find and to be extra careful picking up the jagged edges. She also learned that shattered things are often more resilient than we imagine. Pieces is Lundyn's journey as she discovers that a stained-glass window is merely a collection of broken pieces that tells a new story and gives the illusion that the thick black lines holding it together is intentional.
