The Sign of the Four has a complex plot involving service in India, the Indian Rebellion of 1857, a stolen treasure, and a secret pact among four convicts ("the Four" of the title) and two corrupt prison guards. It presents the detective's drug habit and humanizes him in a way

that had not been done in the preceding novel, *A Study in Scarlet* (1887). It also introduces Doctor Watson's future wife, Mary Morstan.

BOOK THREE: *The Adventures of Sherlock Holmes* is a collection of twelve short stories by Arthur Conan Doyle, first published on 14 October 1892. It contains the earliest short stories featuring the consulting detective Sherlock Holmes, which had been published in twelve monthly issues of *The Strand Magazine* from July 1891 to June 1892. The stories are collected in the same sequence, which is not supported by any fictional chronology. The only characters common to all twelve are Holmes and Dr. Watson and all are related in first-person narrative from Watson's point of view.

BOOK FOUR: *The Memoirs of Sherlock Holmes* is a collection of short stories. The twelve stories were originally published in *The Strand Magazine* from December 1892 to December 1893 as *The Adventures* number 13 to 24. For instance, "The Final Problem" was published under the subheading "XXIV.--The Adventure of the Final Problem."

BOOK FIVE: *The Hound of the Baskervilles* is the third of the four crime novels. Originally serialised in *The Strand Magazine* from August 1901 to April 1902, it is set largely on Dartmoor in Devon in England's West Country and tells the story of an attempted murder inspired by the legend of a fearsome, diabolical hound of supernatural origin. Sherlock Holmes and his companion Dr. Watson investigate the case. This was the first appearance of Holmes since his apparent death in "The Final Problem".

That first collection was initially published by a small press in 2011, and then in 2013 by the premiere Sherlockian publisher, MX Publishing – and after that, there was no turning back. Since then, in addition to editing over 60 volumes (most of which are Sherlockian anthologies), David has written and published over 80 Sherlockian adventures in a variety of anthologies and magazines. Now these are being collected – along with a few others that haven't been seen before. These first five volumes contain the majority of David's Holmesian stories – so far, with additional adventures to be collected and published as part of this ongoing series in 2022.
