At the same time, Kidder writes, most athletes (known as "traceurs" or "freerunners") reject a "daredevil" label, preferring a deliberate, reasoned hedging of bets with their own safety—rather than a "pushing the edge" ethos normally associated with extreme sports.

All in the Game
