The 120 Days of Sodom is the Marquis de Sade's masterpiece. «Los 120 días de Sodoma», o «la Escuela de Libertinage» es una novela descrita como pornográfica y erótica, escrita en 1785. Cuenta la historia de cuatro ricos libertinos masculinos que resuelven experimentar la máxima satisfacción sexual en las orgías. Para hacer esto, se encierran durante cuatro meses en un castillo inaccesible en el corazón de la Selva Negra, con un harén de 36 víctimas, en su mayoría adolescentes varones y mujeres, y contratan a cuatro guardas de burdeles para contar las historias de sus vidas y aventuras. Las narrativas de mujeres forman una inspiración para el abuso sexual y la tortura de las víctimas, que aumenta gradualmente en intensidad y termina en su matanza.

storming of the Bastille. Sade wrote that he "wept tears of blood" over the manuscript's loss. Many consider this to be Sade crowing achievement.

The 120 Days of Sodom, or the School of Libertinism is a novel by the French writer and nobleman Donatien Alphonse François, Marquis de Sade. Described as both pornographic and erotic, it was written in 1785. It tells the story of four wealthy male libertines who resolve to experience the ultimate sexual gratification in orgies. To do this, they seal themselves away for four months in an inaccessible castle in Saint-Martin-de-Belleville, France, with a harem of 46 victims, mostly young male and female teenagers, and engage four female brothel keepers to tell the stories of their lives and adventures. The women's narratives form an inspiration for the sexual abuse and torture of the victims, which gradually mounts in intensity and ends in their slaughter. The work remained unpublished until the twentieth century. In recent times it has been translated into many languages, including English, Japanese and German. Due to its themes of sexual violence and extreme cruelty, it has been banned by some governments.

Ulysses is a novel by the Irish writer James Joyce. It is considered to be one of the most important works of Modernist literature, it has been called "a demonstration and summation of the entire movement". "Before Joyce, no writer of fiction had so foregrounded the process of thinking." However, even proponents of *Ulysses* such as Anthony Burgess have described the book as "inimitable, and also possibly mad". There have been at least 18 different "*Ulysses*" editions (Joyce's handwritten manuscripts were typed by a number of amateur typists). This eBook is a faithful reproduction of the notable first book edition published in Paris on 2 February 1922 by Sylvia Beach at Shakespeare and Company (only 1000 copies were printed). James Augustine Aloysius Joyce (2 February 1882 – 13 January 1941) was an Irish novelist and poet, considered to be one of the most influential writers in the modernist avant-garde of the early 20th century. Joyce is best known for *Ulysses* (1922), a landmark work in which the episodes of Homer's *Odyssey* are paralleled in an array of contrasting literary styles, perhaps most prominent among these the stream of consciousness technique he perfected. Other major works are the short-story collection *Dubliners* (1914), and the novels *A Portrait of the Artist as a Young Man* (1916) and *Finnegans Wake* (1939). His complete oeuvre also includes three books of poetry, a play, occasional journalism, and his published letters.

Sir Arthur Ignatius Conan Doyle DL (22 May 1859 - 7 July 1930) was a Scottish physician and writer who is most noted for his fictional stories about the detective Sherlock Holmes, which are generally considered milestones in the field of crime fiction. He is also known for writing the fictional adventures of a second character he invented, Professor Challenger, and for popularising the mystery of the Mary Celeste. He was a prolific writer whose other works include fantasy and science fiction stories, plays, romances, poetry, non-fiction, and historical novels. Sherlock Holmes is a fictional detective created by Scottish author and physician Sir Arthur Conan Doyle, a graduate of the University of Edinburgh Medical School. A London-based "consulting detective" whose abilities border on the fantastic, Holmes is famous for his astute logical reasoning, his ability to adopt almost any disguise, and his use of forensic science skills to solve difficult cases. Holmes, who first appeared in publication in 1887, was featured in four novels and 56 short stories. The first novel, *A Study in Scarlet*, appeared in Beeton's Christmas Annual in 1887 and the second, *The Sign of the Four*, in Lippincott's Monthly Magazine in 1890. The character grew tremendously in popularity with the first series of short stories in *The Strand Magazine*, beginning with "A Scandal in Bohemia" in 1891; further series of short stories and two novels published in serial form appeared between then and 1927. The stories cover a period from around 1880 up to 1914. All but four stories are narrated by Holmes's friend and biographer, Dr. John H. Watson; two are narrated by Holmes himself ("The Blanched Soldier" and "The Lion's Mane") and two others are written in the third person ("The Mazarin Stone" and "His Last Bow"). In two stories ("The Musgrave Ritual" and "The Gloria Scott"), Holmes tells Watson the main story from his memories, while Watson becomes the narrator of the frame story. The first and fourth novels, *A Study in Scarlet* and *The Valley of Fear*, each include a long interval of omniscient narration recounting events unknown to either Holmes or Watson.

Donatien Alphonse François de Sade, conocido por su título de marqués de Sade (París, 2 de junio de 1740-Charenton-Saint-Maurice, Val-de-Marne, 2 de diciembre de 1814), fue un filósofo y escritor francés, autor de *Los crímenes del amor*, *Aline y Valcour* y otras numerosas novelas, cuentos, ensayos y piezas de teatro. También le son atribuidas *Justine o los infortunios de la virtud*, *Juliette o las prosperidades del vicio*, *Las 120 jornadas de Sodoma* y *La filosofía en el tocador*, entre otras. En sus obras son característicos los antihéroes, protagonistas de violaciones y de disertaciones en las que, mediante sofismas, justifican sus actos. La expresión de un ateísmo radical, además de la descripción de parafilias y actos de violencia, son los temas más recurrentes de sus escritos, en los que prima la idea del

triunfo del vicio sobre la virtud. Fue encarcelado bajo el Antiguo Régimen, la Asamblea Revolucionaria, el Consulado y el Primer Imperio francés, pasando veintisiete años de su vida encerrado en diferentes fortalezas y yásilos para locos.
